Important Meeting Information

Remote Meetings: On March 12, 2020, Governor Newsom issued Executive Order N-25-20, which enhanced State and Local Governments ability to respond to COVID-19 Pandemic based on Guidance for Gatherings issued by the California Department of Public Health. The Executive Order specifically allowed local legislative bodies to hold meetings via teleconference and to make meetings accessible electronically, in order to protect public health. That order expired on September 30, 2021. Governor Newsom has now signed AB 361, and the TAMC Board of Directors approved a resolution to enact AB 361 on September 22, 2021. This legislation permits teleconferencing for Brown Act meetings during a state of emergency. Thus, TAMC meetings will convene remotely, until further notice. 1. Chair Mike Novo called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. A quorum was established, and Maria Montiel took roll call.

2. PUBLIC COMMENTS

Executive Director Todd Muck introduced the newest TAMC member Janneke Strause who will be the new Bicycle and Pedestrian committee coordinator. Ms. Strause introduced herself to the committee.

Hans Hoffman, member of public expressed that potholes are a big problem for bicyclist.

Committee member Martin Wegenstein mentioned that MC connect is an app that you can use to report road issues in the county.

4. 2022 BIKE MAP UPDATE

The Committee received a presentation on the 2022 Bike Map Update project; and provided input on the project's primary goals and map usability.

Janneke Strause, Transportation Planner, reported that the Monterey County Bike Map was last updated in 2016 as part of the Regional Pedestrian and Bicyclist Wayfinding Program for Monterey County. She noted that the primary goals of the 2022 Bike Map Update are to add projects completed since 2016, identify preferred routes, and improve the map's usability.

The Committee had the following comments and input on the 2022 Bike Map Update project:

- Consider an electronic version of the bike map
- Consider adding the legend on the electronic version
- Consider future analysis on listing the high-comfort routes
- Consider preferred turn or preferred route
- Consider adding the major transit stations
- Consider removing Park and Ride lots that are identified on the map since it seems vehicle oriented
- Consider future applications like Strava
- Connect with Go831 and using a QR code for more commuter resources
- Consider future goal introducing scooters onto roadways
- Consider updating the bike shops on map
- Consider distributing the bike maps to each jurisdiction, agencies and work with the hospitality industry
- Consider adding repair stations
- Suggest working with California Highway Patrol on bikers allowed on certain stretches of 101 that Caltrans allows
- Consider adding pedestrian trails
- Consider connecting Fort Ord Trails that can be directly accessed through phone
- Consider another color then purple can be hard to distinguish from the blue, use more contrasting colors or different line weights
- Consider updating the Castroville section
- Consider distributing the map at the tourism convention and agencies with e-bike rebate programs
- Suggest utilizing the Central Coast Joint Data Commission

5. ACTIVE TRANSPORTATION SUPPORT PROGRAM

The Committee received an update on the Active Transportation Support Program Guidelines and application form; and provided input on the revised guidelines and application form.

Alissa Guther, Assistant Transportation Planner, reported that the Active Transportation Support Program formerly operated as the Bike Secure Program as an on-going, rolling grant program with the purpose of promoting active transportation businesses, schools, and agencies with secure bicycle parking, repair stations, skateboard racks and funding for artistic bicycle racks. She noted that the 2021-2022 update of the former Bicycle Secure Program would broaden the program with additional program areas that are intended to increase the access of active transportation modes across Monterey County. In conclusion Ms. Guther went over the updated guidelines with the Committee.

Committee member Mike LeBarre noted that he likes the guidelines booklet and the visual examples. He also mentioned that he is excited on the improved artistic bike rack portion as we see more cities doing more streetscape improvements.

Committee member Pete Scudder asked how is the allocations determined? Alissa Guther replied that the allocation grant is a first come first serve on a rolling basis. She noted that the new application will be sent out after the guidelines updates is approved. Ms. Guther also noted that we will advertise through the Safe Routes to School and Go831.

6. <u>ANNOUNCEMENTS AND/OR COMMENTS</u>

Committee member Eric Petersen suggested putting a discussion on the rights and responsibilities for cyclists as a future meeting agenda item.

Committee member DL Johnson noted that Carmel High School is ready to close the backside of the campus because students were parking on Flanders Road. He mentioned that students are crossing highway 1 during the busy time and is a big issue. They're going to tear out their tennis courts to make room for a parking lot for the students.

Committee member Sloan Campi suggested that Transportation Agency staff reach out and invite the California Highway Patrol for a discussion on the bicycle rider's responsibilities.

Committee member Ernie Gallardo mentioned that he would like to continue to receive the hard copy agenda packet.

Subject: Bicycle Secure Program

RECOMMENDED ACTION:

APPROVE Rogers Hawley's application to the Bicycle Secure Program with the award of three bike racks.

SUMMARY:

Approval by the Bicycle and Pedestrian Facilities Advisory Committee is required for applicants to the Bicycle Secure Program to be awarded.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

Depending on the style of bike rack, the estimated cost ranges from \$600 to \$800, or at most .02% of the annual budget for the Bicycle Secure Program.

DISCUSSION:

This application was submitted by Rogers Hawley, the owner of two mixed use developments in Carmel-by-the-Sea, one called Villa Carmel located at 4th Street and San Carlos Street, and a mixed use property at 1725 Fremont Blvd with 2 commercial tenants and 5 apartments. Mr. Hawley states that he is trying to encourage bicycle usage at all locations and wants to provide bicycle racks for both properties.

Subject: Marina Parking Lot Improvement Project

RECOMMENDED ACTION:

RECEIVE report on the Marina Parking Lot Improvement Project.

SUMMARY:

The Marina Parking Lot Improvement Project will rehabilitate pavement, upgrade pay stations, improve circulation, install lighting, upgrade storm drain and sewer system infrastructure, and improve safety for bicyclists and pedestrians.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

The current project estimate is \$2.8 million.

DISCUSSION:

The City of Monterey is finalizing design of a major parking lot improvement project, the Marina Parking Lot, which serves Downtown Monterey, Fisherman's Wharf and Municipal Wharf 2. The lot is in need of major infrastructure improvement and pavement repair, and this project follows the Waterfront Parking Lot which was completed in 2019 as the first phase of parking lot improvements.

The project includes a major pavement rehabilitation treatment to extend the useful life of the pavement. Additionally the City is changing parking pay stations and combining the Waterfront and Marina Parking Lot into one large surface parking lot. This project will also improve parking circulation by combining the two existing parking lot and reconfiguring the Marina Lot, with the objective of reducing the number of vehicles circulating and idling in the parking lot. The Boat Trailer Parking spaces are also being reconfigured as the Marina Parking Lot serves as the boat launching area. ADA improvements are also included in the project to improve access to the businesses at Municipal Wharf 2.


Other major utility improvements are the installation of safety lighting both in the parking lot, trail and entrances to provide better lighting throughout the site, which is utilized nearly all times of day. Additionally this provides opportunity to improve existing underground utilities such as storm drain and sewer system infrastructure. With any major parking surface lot project, stormwater quality treatments are incorporated into the parking lot in landscaping features which include biofiltration and improve aesthetics of the Marina Parking Lot.

As a result of the parking lot reconfiguration to combine the lots and improve circulation, the City found opportunity to relocate the recreational trail crossing and implement raised crossings which improve pedestrian and bicycle

visibility and access. By relocating the trail crossing the City will be reducing pedestrian and bicycle exposure to vehicles and eliminating a multi-lane threat scenario at the exit of the parking lot.
