1. Chair Wegenstein called the meeting to order at 6:13 p.m. A quorum was established, and Maria Montiel took roll call.

2. PUBLIC COMMENTS

Committee Member Nathalie Gomez announced a Bike Education workshop, Saturdays, 11-2, at 45 El Camino Real, Greenfield.

4. FORT ORD REGIONAL TRAIL AND GREENWAY UPDATE

The Committee received an update on Fort Ord Regional Trail and Greenway (FORTAG) projects in progress.

Mike Zeller, Director of Programming & Project Delivery, presented the FORTAG project and noted that it is proposed as a 28-mile continuous 12-ft wide paved bicycle and pedestrian trail with an open-space buffer on both sides. He noted that FORTAG will connect to the existing Monterey Bay Sanctuary Scenic Trail and will provide connections to unpaved trails in the Fort Ord National Monument. The northern loop of FORTAG encircles Marina, following a 13-mile route that includes three miles of the existing Monterey Bay Coastal Trail. The southern loop of FORTAG encircles the Seaside and bisects Del Rey Oaks, following a 15-mile route that includes four miles of the existing Monterey Bay Coastal Trail. The route includes spurs connecting with existing and planned bike/pedestrian infrastructure. Mr. Zeller noted that an undercrossing below State Route 218 will connect near Del Rey Oaks City Hall and the Frog Pond.

Mr. Zeller presented on the four segments:

- 1) Segment 1 Canyon Del Rey/SR 218
- 2) Segment 2 Imjin Road to Jerry Smith Corridor
- 3) Segment 3 California Avenue from Patton Parkway to Imjin Road
- 4) Segment 4 Laguna Grande Regional Park

The Committee had the following comments and input on the Fort Ord Regional Trail and Greenway projects:

- Consider ensuring the most secure bike racks
- Consider bike repair stations on the trail
- Consider rest stops and benches with shade

5. THE WALK AND ROLL TESTIMONIALS PROJECT

The Committee received a presentation on the Walk and Roll Testimonials Project and provided feedback to Transportation Agency staff.

Ariadne Sambrano, Transportation Planner, reported that the Walk and Roll Testimonials project would replace the Golden Helmet Award. She noted that instead of annually awarding individual bicycle advocates and commuters, testimonial videos would highlight personal stories from the Monterey County community that could be shared online, on social media, and through Transportation Agency programming. Ms. Sambrano noted that this initiative aims to capture and share diverse experiences to normalize and encourage more active transportation.

The Committee had the following comments and input on the Walk and Roll Testimonials Project:

- Consider a diverse representation of the community, highlighting different age, cultural, geographic, and linguistic groups for testimonials
- Consider bike and pedestrian safety messages
- Consider a Tik-Tok-style 10-20 second video format to share on social media
- Consider a different name for the program such as "Story of the Streets"
- Consider a short podcast with topical questions such as safety and health
- Consider interviewing individuals on bikes and pedestrians at rest stops or bike trails
- Consider monthly reels and hashtags, asking viewers to contribute their stories
- Consider asking the funniest bike moment or what is the craziest thing you can carry on your cargo bike

Committee Member Eric Petersen announced that in Portland they have a separate Pedestrian Committee, and they have innovative ideas.

Chair Martin Wegenstein announced that the Board officially adopted the revised BPC bylaws.

Subject: San Ardo Community and Schools Connections Project

RECOMMENDED ACTION:

RECEIVE a presentation on the San Ardo Community and Schools Connections Project.

SUMMARY:

The County of Monterey received a grant from the statewide Active Transportation Program for various bicycle and pedestrian projects around Monterey County. One of the projects that received funding is to improve safety for pedestrians walking to school in the unincorporated community of San Ardo.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

The California Transportation Commission awarded \$3,448,000 to the County of Monterey in State Active Transportation Program Cycle 6 funding for the San Ardo Community and Schools Connections Project.

DISCUSSION:

On December 7, 2022, the California Transportation Commission awarded \$44.8 million in Active Transportation Program grant funding for seven projects across Monterey County that would enhance safety and facilitate active modes of transportation. Of the \$44.8 million, \$3,448,000 million was awarded to the County of Monterey to improve community and school connections in the unincorporated community of San Ardo, which is located in District 3 in South Monterey County. This project includes an infrastructure component, which will be led by the Monterey County Public Works Department and a non-infrastructure component led by the Health Department. This update is primarily focused on the infrastructure component of the project.

The project scope is to construct new curb and gutter, sidewalks, pavement markings, rectangular rapid flashing beacons (RRFB), signage, and lighting on streets that connect to San Ardo School and other community services. The streets that would receive these enhancements are as follows:

- College Street: From Annette Street to Cattlemen Road
- Center Street: From Annette Street to Jolon Road
- Godchaux Street: From College Street to Center Street

The intersections of Cattlemen Rd/College St and Cattlemen Rd/Center St will include RRFBs and high visibility crosswalks to improve the safety of pedestrians walking across Cattlemen Rd, which serves as a truck route for nearby agricultural and oil field industries. The installation of sidewalks will

be designed in compliance with the American and Disabilities Act (ADA).

The County of Monterey plans to conduct community outreach throughout the project from June 2024 to December 2026. Final designs are expected to be completed by December 2024. Construction is estimated to take place from September 2025 through June 2026.

Erich Rauber, Senior Civil Engineer at the County of Monterey Public Works Department, will present the update at the meeting.

Subject: Reimagining the Walk and Roll Testimonials Project: Enhancing Community

Engagement and Outreach

RECOMMENDED ACTION:

DISCUSS and **PROVIDE** feedback on the Walk and Roll Testimonials Project.

SUMMARY:

The Walk and Roll Testimonials project aims to replace the Golden Helmet Award by featuring personal stories from the Monterey County community. These testimonials will be shared online and through various social media platforms, capturing diverse experiences to promote active transportation. The objective is to engage the committee in renaming the project and developing various strategies to maximize outreach and impact.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

There is no financial impact associated with the recommended action.

DISCUSSION:

The Golden Helmet Award, initiated in 2010, aimed to recognize dedicated bicyclists in Monterey County. Despite its success in highlighting individual advocates, it did not significantly increase walking and biking rates. To address this, staff proposes transitioning to the Walk and Roll Testimonials project, focusing on video testimonials from a broad spectrum of community members. These videos will highlight the benefits of walking and biking, aiming to inspire a larger audience.

Committee Feedback from Last Meeting:

The Committee provided valuable input on the Walk and Roll Testimonials Project at the May Bicycle and Pedestrian Facilities Advisory Committee meeting, which included:

- 1. **Diverse Representation:** Emphasize testimonials from various community groups, including different ages, cultures, geographies, and languages.
- 2. **Test Run:** Suggested conducting a test run for the videos before the full launch of the campaign.
- 3. Safety Messages: Incorporate bike and pedestrian safety messages.
- 4. Short Video Format: Utilize a Tik-Tok-style format with 10-20 second videos for social media.
- 5. **Program Name:** Consider renaming the program to something creative and engaging.
- 6. **Podcast Idea:** Explore short podcasts with topics on safety and health.
- 7. **Interview Settings:** Conduct interviews at rest stops or bike trails with individuals on bikes and pedestrians.

- 8. **Monthly Reels and Hashtags:** Create monthly video reels and use hashtags to encourage viewer contributions.
- 9. **Engaging Content:** Ask engaging questions like the funniest bike moment or the craziest item carried on a cargo bike.

Proposed Next Steps:

- Brainstorm New Names: Staff seeks the committee's creative ideas for renaming the project.
- Outreach Strategies: Develop outreach strategies to identify individuals for potential interviews. Suggestions include leveraging social media trends, collaborating with local influencers, and asking committee members to recommend individuals for interviews.

Staff will lead a discussion at the meeting.
