### 1. QUORUM CHECK – CALL TO ORDER

Norm Groot, Committee Chair, called the meeting to order at 1:41 p.m. A quorum was established.

### 2. PUBLIC COMMENTS

None.

### 3. DEVELOP AND PREPARE A FORMAT FOR THE MEASURE X ANNUAL AUDIT REPORT

Norm Groot, Committee Chair, opened the discussion to develop a new format for the Measure X Citizens Oversight Committee's Annual Audit Report by reviewing how the report is currently presented in the TAMC Annual Report. Members then reviewed and discussed the proposed format changes presented by Committee member Mitchell during the November 14, 2024, Measure X Oversight Committee meeting; followed subsequently with a review and discussion of a revised format proposal submitted by TAMC staff at the November meeting based upon input from the Oversight Committee and a second revised graphic presented for today's meeting.

The committee noted that the second revised format presented by TAMC staff presented at today's meeting incorporated more of the format changes proposed by Member Mitchell. Upon further discussion, the Committee agreed to present a 2-page report that would be printed in the TAMC Annual Report and mailed to Monterey County residents. The composition of the 2-page report will include the "wall compliance chart," the new graphic presented by TAMC staff at the November meeting which incorporates changes suggested by the Committee and the Chair's narrative. It was noted that this graphic includes some changes requested by Member Mitchell.

The committee then discussed the option of creating a secondary more in-depth report as had been proposed during the November 19, 2024, Oversight Committee meeting. This report will be published online on the Transportation Agency's website at www.tamcmonterey.org.

At the conclusion of the discussion, the committee agreed that the composition of the 2-page report will include a "5-year period wall compliance chart," the new graphic presented by TAMC staff at the November Committee meeting and the Chair's narrative. The motion was made by Member Dayton, seconded by Member McPherson, and passed unanimously.

After a clarifying question from staff, the motion was amended to support re-alphabetizing the list of jurisdictions in the "5-year wall chart" and the TAMC staff graphic, with the inclusion of the Chair's narrative. The motion was amended by Member Dayton, seconded by Member McPherson, and passed unanimously.

The committee agreed to present the new proposed format of the Measure X Annual Audit Report to the Measure X Citizens Oversight Committee in February 2025, and to defer any decisions about the in-depth on-line annual report until after receiving input from the February meeting.

### **RECOMMENDED ACTION:**

**REVIEW** Measure X audit reports for fiscal year 2023/24; and **PREPARE** the Measure X Citizens Oversight Committee Annual Report.

## **SUMMARY:**

The Measure X Citizens Oversight Committee ensures transparency in the use of Measure X funds through audits and annual reports. The Audit Sub-Committee will meet to review the FY 2023-24 annual audit reports submitted by the jurisdictions and to prepare the Measure X Citizens Oversight Committee's Annual Report.

### **FINANCIAL IMPACT:**

In the past fiscal year, 2023/2024, Measure X generated \$38.375 million in revenues. Of that amount, after payment of administrative expenses, 60% was distributed to the cities and the County for local street and road projects, while the remaining 40% was programmed to regional safety and mobility projects.

### **DISCUSSION:**

The Measure X Citizens Oversight Committee is charged with ensuring transparency and accountability in the expenditure of Measure X sales tax funds. This responsibility includes conducting independent audits, reviewing project delivery schedules, making recommendations on the Transportation Safety & Investment Plan, and preparing comprehensive annual reports for the public and the Transportation Agency Board of Directors.

The Measure X annual audit report appears as a section within the Transportation Agency for Monterey County Annual Report (linked below) and is a summary compilation of the information provided by the jurisdictions to verify their compliance. After the release of the most recent annual report for fiscal year 2022/23, committee and Transportation Agency Board members provided feedback regarding the presentation and content of the Measure X annual audit report. This feedback included requests to:

- Provide more comprehensive financial information, including detailed figures for revenues, expenses, or allocations.
- Clarify language used in the report, such as "Late compliance," to be more clear about the compliance status of jurisdictions.
- Include information on the 40% of funds allocated for regional projects, along with the 60% of

Measure X funds for local jurisdictions.

To address the feedback received from the committee and TAMC Board, staff presented proposed changes to the annual report template at the August 20, 2024 Citizens Oversight Committee Meeting:

- 1. <u>Inclusion of Detailed Financial Data</u>: Comprehensive tables showing total Measure X revenues, expenditures, and allocations for each jurisdiction.
- 2. <u>Clarification of Compliance Status</u>: Revised language for clarity, indicating full compliance or ongoing issues.
- 3. <u>Expansion of Reporting</u>: Inclusion of information on the 40% of funds allocated to regional projects, ensuring comprehensive oversight.

Feedback on the proposed changes at the August meeting included:

- More information is needed about what it means to be out of compliance
- Include pie charts of spending or other infographics
- Provide the summary financials chart
- Tell the story about why jurisdictions are not spending all the Measure X funds they receive

On November 19, 2024, staff proposed for the Audit Sub-Committee to produce a standalone Measure X Annual Report in order to provide all the information requested by the committee and facilitated discussion with the Committee on a draft outline for how the proposed Measure X Annual Report could be compiled:

- 1. Executive Summary from the Measure X Oversight Committee Chair
- 2. Measure X Overview
- 3. Summary Compliance Chart
- 4. Funding and Spending Infographic
- 5. How Funds are Leveraged: Project Spotlight
- 6. Annual Fiscal Profile Revenues and Expenditures
- 7. Carryover Balances and Upcoming Projects

Examples of the compliance chart, infographics, fiscal profile, and annual reports from comparative agencies were included as attachments and links in the staff report. At the conclusion of the presentation, the Measure X Citizens Oversight Committee directed the Audit Sub-Committee to develop, prepare, and submit an annual report format to the full committee for consideration that provides visually-understandable data to the public that would indicate the success or failure of the local jurisdictions to make Measure X expenditures in a timely and compliant manner.

On December 10, 2024, the Measure X Citizens Oversight Audit Subcommittee met to discuss the design of the new annual report format. Their discussion include a review of the proposed Compliance Chart presented by Committee Member Mitchell, the revised Draft Measure X Audit Compliance Report submitted by TAMC staff at the November meeting, and a second revised draft Measure X Audit Compliance Report submitted by TAMC staff during that meeting on December 10, 2024.

At the conclusion of the discussion, the committee voted unanimously that the new format of the Measure X Citizens Oversight Committee Annual Report would be a 2-page report summary that will

include a "5-year wall compliance chart," the new graphic presented by TAMC staff at the November Committee meeting and the Chair's narrative. They further agreed that the jurisdictions in the wall compliance chart and the new graphic will be listed in alphabetical order. This 2-page Measure X Citizens Oversight Committee Annual Report will be printed, as customary in the TAMC Annual Report distributed by mail to Monterey County residents.

This meeting is to review the 2023-24 annual audit reports submitted by the jurisdictions and to prepare the Measure X Citizens Oversight Committee's Annual Report featuring the new agreed upon format. The report will be presented to the Measure X Citizens Oversight Committee on February 18, 2025.
